Multiple resource compatibility uploads and downloads. Link within a course to a file or other material with additional information.	Questionnaires with question bank. Design and implement quizzes consisting of a large variety of question types.	Backups and restore of courses – No more course size restrictions
Lessons - series of interactive pages that require user interaction before advancing.	Grade book with speed and flexibility. You set up assessments and view results in the grade books. Administration is made easy with reports you can export and import within Moodle.	File handling – Effective file handling for the students and course creators
SCORM package compliant - Sharable Content Object Reference Model is a collection of specifications that enable interoperability, accessibility and reusability of Web-based learning content.	Assignments - collect work from students, review it and provide helpful feedback.	Navigation – Navigation and settings block on each page makes easy access incredible
Link to external webpages	Surveys - standard, verified survey instruments that have proven useful in evaluating what users are doing and thinking in their courses.	Roles and permissions –Logical for the user to allocate the roles and permissions on Moodle.

Comments - User comments (Glossaries, Databases, Blogs, etc.) are consistently handled and displayed throughout Moodle	Choice - provides a means to run polls, elections or general information gathering from participants in a course.	Cohorts / Site-wide groups - Site-wide collections of users that can be enrolled into courses in one action
Messaging - All email sent by Moodle are treated as a message	My private files block - Allows access to a user's private files	Plagiarism prevention - Supports integration with plagiarism prevention tools
Forums - A communication tool for users to submit content for all to read and discuss.	Community block - Enables users to search for courses to download or enrol in on a community hub and lists courses which the user is enrolled in.	Web services support - Expose particular functions of Moodle for use by administrative systems such as HR, SIS applications and Mobile clients
User Profile Pages - Site-wide user profile page can be customised by users with blocks, news, feeds , etc.	Course completion status block - Reports on the completion status of your courses	Notes - Detailed notes can be kept about individual users
Comments block - Great for student feedback	Navigation – Navigation and settings block on each page makes easy access incredible	Backups and restore of courses – no course size restrictions
Chat - Allows participants to have real-time synchronous discussions on the Web.	Search function	Roles and permissions – More logical for the user to allocate the roles and permissions on Moodle.
Collaboration Tools	Language - Language translation tool improvements & new language packs	Course completion (activity completion by grade, date or a number of other criteria) and prerequisites (allows ordered progression and scaffolding)
Groups - allows a teacher to assign teachers and students to one or more groups	Course List - Enables navigation between all of the courses in which the logged in user is enrolled	Secure login page - Allows a user to login with credentials from the front page of the site, rather than from a separate login page.
Wiki - Web page that everyone in a course can create together without needing to know HTML	News Items - updated list of the latest news items.	Outcomes - Grade against multiple outcomes that's connected to activities and courses
Workshop - a peer assessment activity with many options. Students submit their work via an on line text tool and attachments.	Administrative Tools	Community hubs - a directory of courses for public or private community use
Glossary - Allows participants to create and maintain a list of definitions, similar to a dictionary.	Calendar - Displays site, course and group events in calendar format.	Repository support – integration with external repositories of content
Blogs are a form of online journal. Versatile and movable. Blogs in Moodle are user based - each user has their own Blog	Label - Add text to the content area of your course.	Portfolio support – export module data to external systems for example snapshots of forums, assignments, etc. to record in a journal or a portfolio of evidence
Database - collaboratively build, display and search a bank of record entries.	Blocks - Visibility control with role (guests vs enrolled users visibility control) & more. Robust block and module uninstalling
